



HealthBridge seeking implementation partners

In Africa – like in many other places in the world – public spaces are used for public life, commerce and interaction. However, lack of funds, planning, and maintenance, as well as priority for motorized vehicles, has turned many public spaces into unsafe, unforgiving and unconnected places. In addition, many public spaces are difficult to access, especially for those living in vulnerable situations. This is especially the case for our three partner cities: Kampala, Niamey and Accra. There is a significant lack of formal public spaces in each of these cities, particularly in the outlying areas where the slum settlements are located. Of those spaces that do exist, they are degraded, of poor quality, and under constant threat of being developed into other purposes.

HealthBridge has received a grant to implement a public space project in the cities of Accra, Ghana, Niamey, Niger and Kampala, Uganda. We are seeking implementation partners to help us organize public spaces pilot projects and policy campaigns in the three cities.
